Improved **30,932 linear feet of trails**
Constructed **2 park connector trails** to regional trail systems
Created a Trail Discovery Guide, featuring **18 popular trails** in the parks

Planted **9 native species meadows** covering **37.83 acres**

300+ annual volunteers assisting with park projects

Actively working on **6 major capital projects:**

- Observation Tower at North Park
- Settlers Cabin Mine Pollution Clean-up
- Suffragist Grove at Hartwood Acres
- Paul Riis Trail at South Park
- Round Hill Visitors Center Rain Garden
- Edgebrook Shelter Restoration at South Park

Reforested **22.54 acres** by planting **10,801 trees, shrubs and live stakes** and **13,362 perennials**

Conducted **ecological assessments** of 7 of the 9 parks with one more on the way
Over **10.5 miles of streams** studied in 3 of the 9 parks

Recently completed **major capital projects** including:

- Sculpture Garden at Hartwood Acres
- Cascades at South Park
- Nevin Shelter Restoration at South Park
- North Park Lake Trail

Funded **4 livestock shelters** and erected **100 Chimney Swift Habitat Towers**


Installed over **80 public park benches**, funded by generous donors

Treating **millions of gallons** of polluted stream water from old coal mines each year

Allegheny County Parks offer year-round recreation, with **279** facilities to rent, **2** golf courses, **4** pools, **2** skating rinks, **1** ski slope, **1** adaptive basketball court, **4** lakes, **23** creeks and streams, and **200** miles of trails.
