Improved **30,932 linear feet of trails**
Created a Trail Discovery Guide
Constructed **2** park connector trails to regional trail systems and studied **23.5** miles of trail to connect 2 parks

Planted **10** native species meadows covering **42.33 acres**

300+ annual volunteers assisting with park projects

Actively working on **7 major capital projects:**

- Observation Tower at North Park
- Round Hill Visitors Center Rain Garden
- Edgebrook Shelter Restoration at South Park
- Riparian Restoration at North Fork Pine Creek in North Park

Reforested **27.6 acres** by planting **11,879 trees, shrubs and live stakes** and **21,934 perennials**
833 trees and shrubs were planted using our Tree Fund

Conducted **ecological assessments** of 7 of the 9 parks with one more underway
Over **48.33 miles of streams** studied in 6 of the 9 parks

Recently completed **major capital projects** including:

- Cascades at South Park
